Saint Paul the Apostle

Paul, born Saul of Tarsus, never met Jesus face-to-face as the other apostles had, yet his entire life was changed by a supernatural encounter with Christ.

A Jewish zealot, Saul was on his way to Damascus to arrest followers



of Jesus, when suddenly a great light flashed around him and he fell to the ground. He

heard a voice say, "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting me?" He said, "Who are you, Lord?" The voice replied, "I am Jesus and you are persecuting me...." (Acts 9:3-6). In an instant, Saul knew Jesus was the miraculous fulfillment of all he had been pursuing in his scrupulous observance of the law of the Pharisees. This profound event was the beginning of his own intimate relationship with Christ.

Paul then spent his life tirelessly proclaiming the message of the Cross—that through the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ, our sins are forgiven and we can receive eternal life. The Power of the Cross

He was born to die so we could live!

hen you enter a
Pacem Hermitage you notice
the large plain
wooden Cross over the little
altar. The Cross is THE sign
and symbol of God's love for
us. "God so loved the world that
he gave his only Son ...that the
world might be saved through
him. [John 3:16-17]

Because the Cross was the instrument chosen by God it has become the sign of and reminder of that great love God has for all of us. "Greater love than this no one has than to lay down his life for his friends." [John 15:13]

The Cross is made from the wood of a tree. Original sin came into the world through a tree in the Garden of Eden so deliverance from sin and eternal life is won for us through the tree of the Cross.

We were incapable of freeing ourselves from the burden, bondage and death of sin. Jesus, the Son of God, came to do for us what we could not do for ourselves. He was born to die so that we could be free and live.

The Cross addresses the mystery of suffering in this world. Though the mystery of suffering remains, what is revealed in the Cross is Jesus entry into and accompanying us in our suffering. He loves us and shows us the way to ultimate victory over

sin and suffering and death. He tells us: "If anyone wishes to come after me, let him deny himself and take up his Cross every day and follow me." [Luke 14:27]



The Cross . . the central truth of our Christian faith

That daily Cross is an emptying of self so as to live in an entirely selfless manner, as Jesus Himself did.

When you see a plain Cross without its Crucified, the Saints remind us, that Cross is your Cross: the Cross of each day, the hidden Cross, without splendor or consolation – the Cross which is awaiting the Crucified it lacks; and that Crucified is you in mystical union with Christ.
