Pacem's History

The story of Pacem in Terris is about God's love and the faith of His people.

As a religious education director, founder Shirley Wanchena was deeply aware of people's spiritual hunger, their universal need to experience God's love, and their longing to discover His plan for their lives.

With prayerful discernment and counsel, in 1979 she accepted God's invitation to "Create an environment where my people can come and be alone with me." Based on the history of the church and Shirley's personal prayer experience, this translated into

the building of hermitages. With the prayers and practical support of family and friends, in 1982 the first 80 acres of forest and prairie land were purchased. Church and county approvals were given to establish a hermitage retreat center.

On May 1, 1988, three hermitages were ready and the first hermit guests arrived. And people continued to arrive, learning about Pacem from newspaper articles and word of mouth. The hermits' stories, notes, and testimonies confirmed that this retreat center was God's plan. Miracle upon miracle revealed the unique ways God ministered to each person and drew them into an intimate experience of His great love for them.

Throughout the years, Pacem in Terris has been enriched spiritually by official blessings of the church through pastors, local bishops, and Pope John Paul II.

Whenever the need for additional hermitages, land, roads, trails, and equipment became evident, God provided the funds through the generous hearts and gifts of His people.

Today, Pacem in Terris has 240 acres and a total of 19 hermitages, including a beautiful community building, Our Lady of Pacem.

The mission of Pacem in Terris continues as we prayerfully seek God's will and wait in joyful expectation of what is to come. ♦



- 1988 Three hermitages open and the first hermit guests arrive
- 1991 Visitation house with pole barn and 20 acres purchased
- 1992 Papal blessing. Four more hermitages open
- 1994 San Damiano house, garage and 40 more acres purchased
- 1996 Three more hermitages open
- 2000 Six more hermitages open, plus three indoor hermitages. Our Lady of Pacem opens and is dedicated
- 2003 Prayer Partners are formed; now about 430 people pray daily for Pacem
- 2008 Since the beginning, about 8,000 hermits have come "to be alone with God"

“Coming Home”

Pacem in Terris (*Peace on Earth*) is a spiritual home for our hermit guests.

It begins when you turn onto the driveway and move from the smooth tarred road, becoming aware of the sound of gravel crunching under the wheels of the car. Driving more slowly, you take a deep breath and a quiet peace fills the restless space within you. You have stepped outside the world of schedules, expectations, and responsibilities into a world of peace and freedom. You have arrived at a spiritual home prepared for you by God.

Following the “guest parking” signs, you park your car and walk a short wooded path to the main house—in the early years, you arrived at St. Joseph House; now you arrive at Our Lady of Pacem. About the names: We invited St. Joseph, the earthly father of Jesus, to be a prayerful provider for Pacem. The miracles that needed to happen to secure the very first Pacem home happened. St. Joseph House became the first “welcome home” stop for staff and hermits. And then after

many years had passed and more hermitages and roads were built, once again we enlisted St. Joseph and the many hermitage saints to pray for our additional housing needs. Through the generosity of believers, more hermitages were built and the miracle that is Our Lady of Pacem community house now provides a warm welcome to all our guest hermits.

Like everyone who arrives home tired and weary from daily life, you need some time to let go, to symbolically “kick off your shoes” and enjoy that deep breath of freedom. We give you a simple, warm welcome and inquire into any special needs. This helps prepare you to enter the heart of the spiritual home, the hermitage. It’s the special “room” that’s prepared for your intimate time alone with God. There you find your true spiritual home, the home of the heart, where the Holy Spirit dwells. The Holy Spirit welcomes you, and in God’s great love, cares for you—body, soul, and spirit. ◆
